## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Staff, Students and Friends of our Marymede Community,

### The Art of Stillness and Learning

When asked when we feel closest to God, many describe an encounter with nature – a quiet forest, a sunrise or sunset, a surging ocean – as a moment of peace and stillness when they connect with the spiritual. I know myself it is in these moments of solitude and beauty that something connects deep down and I recognise God's presence in my life.

Last year I participated in a spiritual retreat with fellow Principals and learnt about the Indigenous experience of dadirri - connecting with nature. The gift of dadirri is an inner deep listening and quiet awareness recognising the deep spirit inside each of us.

In the busyness of everyday life, it is too easy to ignore the call to be still and to connect to the spirit within. We need to make time for the Spirit of God within each of us. We cannot listen to the sound of this deep, inner calling unless we find places in our lives for silence. The sound is the Word of God – Jesus.

We wish the Year 6 students and staff travelling to Canberra over the next fortnight an enjoyable time. Our students visit places such as Parliament House and the War Memorial which will assist in their learning about the history of our great nation.

I attended the Brigidine Asylum Seeker Centre workshop and learned about three ways to make a difference: get informed, be critical of the media's point of views and be courageous enough to search for the facts. At the Catholic Mission session, they mentioned that giving money though helpful but does not always empower people who are poor. By taking no action to change people's circumstances, we allow oppression to continue.

The inspirational speaker at the Benenson Society workshop made you want to go out and create change. I learned how their Society aims to maintain human rights by advocating to abolish torture and the death penalty. The Caritas speaker explained how only a very small portion of the world is now ideal for growing crops. It made me realise that if we don't act as responsible stewards right now, we will soon run out of resources.

### **End of Semester Examinations**

Year 9 students will sit six examinations between Monday June 15 and Wednesday June 17. The examination timetable and associated information has been emailed and the schedule was also published in the last newsletter. During the week I spoke to all Year 9s to ensure they understand the importance of preparing well and doing their best in all examinations. Students will attend Tutor Group each morning and then assemble on the basketball courts in Core Groups so they can be guided into the Fitness Centre. All examinations are 80 minutes long, including reading time.

There are no examinations during Period 5 each day. On Monday afternoon, students will meet with Mr Adamson for career and subject selection information. On Tuesday, they

will participate in Sport as usual and on Wednesday, normal lessons will resume.

### **Subject Information**

All parents of current Year 9 and 10 students are encouraged to attend an information evening on Thursday June 25 at 7.00pm in the Auditorium to introduce you to the curriculum pathways available for your child in 2016. We will be outlining the VET (Vocational Education and Training) subjects available, including those that offered in our new Trade Skills Centre. Additionally, our 2016 curriculum structure will potentially enable acceleration into all of the Unit 1 and 2 subjects we offer.

Parents of students moving into VCE next year will also hear about how we will be further improving what is offered in Year 11 and 12. We are extending our range of subjects and increasing the time allocation for study to truly enhance the education your son/daughter is receiving at Marymede.

In **tournament**, we learnt about the process of becoming a knight. We were given the chance to try different knight training methods. We got to try different weapons and even hit the instructor with them!



## BUSINESS OFFICE

### Finance News

The Victorian Government have unveiled a \$148 million initiative called the Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) to ensure all Victorian students can take part in school trips and sporting activities. The CSEF will run over four years.

Camps, sports and excursions are all inclusive within the College fees paid by all families, therefore, this payment can be used to offset the cost of school fees. Payments will go directly to the school but be tied to the relevant student.

**\$125 per year will be paid for eligible primary school students and \$225 per year for eligible secondary school students.**

Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply. To be eligible for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered primary or secondary school must meet the following requirements on the first day of Term 2 OR on the first day of Term 3:

- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004 (that is, be the holder of a Veterans Affairs Gold Card or an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or a Pensioner Concession Card (PCC)) OR be a temporary foster parent, and;
- b) Submit an application to the College by the due date - 26 June 2015.

Parents receiving a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income-tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with (a) and (b) above.

If you are eligible for this payment, please complete and return the attached form and a copy of your Card to the College Reception.
