FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Staff, Students and Friends of our Marymede Community,

Interim Reports

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL LEARNING AND TEACHING NEWS PREP – YEAR 12

Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews

Progress interviews for primary and secondary students will be held on **April 12 from 10am-8pm** and, for secondary students only, from **April 18 from 4-7pm**. Secondary School Interviews and interviews with Primary Specialist Teachers (e.g. Italian, Art etc.) will be held in **The Fitness Centre**. Primary School Interviews with core teachers will be held in **Primary School Classrooms**. A list of room locations will be visible on the day of interviews at the Main and Primary Offices and on the doors of each Primary House.

Interviews are scheduled for 15 minute slots for core teachers in primary and in 10 minute slots for secondary teachers and primary specialists; if there is a need for more time, parents are encouraged to contact teachers to arrange to meet at an alternate time, rather than book multiple slots. Similarly, given the limited interview slots available, secondary students who have the same teacher for more than one subject are encouraged to book a single interview slot, rather than multiple slots with the same teacher.

We would strongly encourage students to attend the Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews. The importance of students participating in a dialogue about their learning and being a part of the conversation about their progress, achievements and areas for development is essential to giving them a sense of ownership of their learning.

A **reminder for Secondary school parents** that Term 1 **Interim Reports** are available via our Parent Access Module (PAM) from Thursday March 24, 2016 until 1:00pm Monday April 11. Details instructions about booking interviews has been sent to all families. Interim Reports

For secondary students, interim reports will be available via PAM from March 24. The interim reports are designed to provide a simple snapshot of your son or daughter's approach to their studies this term. We would encourage all parents to have read this interim report prior to attending Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews.

Learning and Teaching Initiatives

In our recent newsletters, we have outlined a number of the initiatives that will enhance opportunities and outcomes for our students at Marymede; this week we are highlighting the work that is underway in literacy.

Initiative 3: Under the guidance of our new primary literacy coordinator, we are investigating a literacy program Prep – Year 6 that prioritises the development of comprehension skills keeping pace with decoding.

While our students have traditionally moved through the reading levels, demonstrating fine decoding skills, an exploration of our reading data suggested that their comprehension skills have not always kept pace with their decoding skills. As such, we will be implementing programs that focus on actively fostering sophisticated comprehension skills that equip students for their secondary studies and beyond. I look forward to providing updates as key phases of this new approach are implemented.

Booking Appointments On-line

Bookings for Interviews can be made on-line through the PAM which you can on the College's website. Bookings can be made online from March 24, 2016 for Primary and Secondary School.

You can access the booking system in the following way:

1. Go to the College's website:

2. Click the PAM icon as shown right:
3. Enter your **Logon** and **Password**.

Full instructions are provided to you after you log on however, please note the following points:

- When you log on, the system displays the names of your child/children. Please make sure you **complete all steps** in the booking process.
- If your child has a teacher for more than one subject, you are able to only book one timeslot.
- When you have made your bookings, you can **print a summary of your bookings** in time order.
- Please ensure that **the time settings on your home computer are correct** as if they are not then you will not see the accurate times when you make a booking.
- Please ensure that you select **SAVE** as you are making your bookings.
- Other parents may be making bookings at the same time that you are using the system. It is possible, though unlikely, that a timeslot will be displayed to you as available but it is then booked by another

parent shortly afterwards. If you then attempt to book this timeslot it will not be available and a message will be displayed to indicate this.

- If you do not have internet access or if you encounter any problems using the system, please notify the College's Main Reception on 9407-9000 or the IT Helpdesk on helpdesk@marymede.vic.edu.au
- Bookings can be made up to 1:00pm Monday April 11 for appointments on April 12. (You will still be able to access your bookings and print a list). Bookings will re-open at 9:00am on Wednesday April 13 for Secondary school bookings for April 18 interviews and close on Friday April 15 at 5:00pm.

Inaugural House Welcome BBQ's



Information Communication Technology Update

Warranty, Damages of Devices

While students are natural users of technology, they also have to be responsible citizens and members of the school community. As such, students are primarily responsible for the care, security, proper use and proper functioning of their computer. We would also ask that parents play a role in monitoring these aspects of the Computer Program. Students are expected to use their computer during 2016 in all of their classes. This will be further supported by ebooks for all core subjects in 2016 in Years 7-10. The computer is the property of Marymede Catholic College. At the end of 2016 Year 9 and

Year 12 students will need to return their computers to the College. These devices will be returned to the Lease Company. They must be in good working order and physical condition.

Please refer to the attached document on the side bar about process and costs to be incurred for damages to devices. If the Notebook is lost, stolen or damaged, you must report this to the IT Helpdesk immediately. An **Incident Report Form** is to be completed and submitted to the Helpdesk.

Accidental Damage and Non Accidental Damage

There are two types of damage as defined by the College: Accidental Damage (which covers matters of general wear and tear) and Non-Accidental Damage (as outlined in attached document).

Accidental Damage is covered by a \$100 excess for each claim and Non-Accidental Damage is covered by a \$300 excess.

Theft or Loss of Charger and or Stylus

- Damage, theft or loss of AC adaptor
- Damage, theft or loss of stylus

In these circumstances the full costs of repairs will be charged to families. These costs are less than \$100. Chargers must be purchased via the College as they have to be original Toshiba chargers (no third party chargers are accepted) in order to ensure that warranty is not void.

Carparking

We are very concerned at the increasingly dangerous driving practices around the College at drop off and pick up times.

We know the start and end of the school day can be hectic for parents and finding parking can be a challenge but it has become apparent that the community is no longer prepared to tolerate unsafe and illegal traffic behaviour. We have implemented various measures to try and reduce congestion in local streets and at the same time ensure the safety of our students. We are working with the Whittlesea City Council with regards to increased supervision in this area.

The College is constantly informed by Parents that Drivers are:

- Double Parking on Williamsons Road
- Blocking Pedestrian crossings
- Speeding in Drop off/Pickup zone
- Parking in the Drop off/Pickup zone
- Entering from Exit Only gates
- Blocking Entry Gates

This was particularly dangerous for cars trying to park at the College and pedestrians and students who were trying to cross the road to reach the College.

We share the concern of our community and urge you to consider your child's safety and the safety of others when you are dropping off and picking up from the College. Please also bear in mind that as a parent of Marymede Catholic College you represent the school; we do not want our good name tarnished by the thoughtlessness of some members of our community.

We thank you for your cooperation and support in this important matter.

CDF Banking

The College is able to offer Students a deposit account using the Catholic Development fund banking system.

The School Agency is a "deposit only" agency, which allows students to make deposits into savings accounts at a specified school on a specific banking day each week.

Withdrawals cannot be processed at the school; however they can be arranged with the help of the agency.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE - CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom.

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum. CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families.

The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students.
- \$225 for secondary school students.
