Year 7 2020 Parent Information Evening

I welcome parents of Year 5 students to our Year 7 2020 Information Evening which will be held in the Auditorium from 7.00pm on Thursday 26 July. If you have friends who have children in Year 5, please ask them to come along and find out what our College has to offer in the Secondary school. Senior staff will be in attendance to answer any questions you may have. The date for the return of enrolment applications is Friday 3 August.

ELC Enrolments

I have been delighted with the number of enrolments we have received for both three and four-year-old kindergarten for next year. Any family interested in enrolling their child into the Marymede Early Learning Centre is strongly encouraged to submit their application now to avoid the disappointment of being placed on the waiting list.

Federal Government Funding to Non-Government Schools

During the holidays a report was released by the National School Resourcing Board (NSRB) which was directed by the Federal Government to review the current Socio-Economic Status (SES) model used to determine funding to non-Government schools.

The final report revealed that the SES Score Methodology was flawed and overstated or understated the capacity to contribute for some schools.

The NSRB has recommended an alternative model where the parents' income level is used to determine the school's capacity to contribute.

The initial reaction from the Catholic sectors to the report has been positive in terms of the acknowledgement made that the current SES model is flawed. They have constantly asked the Government to create a fair and equitable model which does not disadvantage non-Government schools.

I will provide a further update on the funding review in the next Newsletter.

Year 11 Retreat: 2-3 August

Our Year 11 students will be participating in their two-day Christian Leadership Retreat on 2 and 3 August. I look forward to visiting the three retreat sites and spending time talking to the students about the qualities we are looking for in our young people who aspire to be leaders in our school community.

I have just returned from the Australian Catholic Secondary Principal's Conference which was held in Cairns. The theme of the conference 'Leading in Diverse Times' was very relevant and thought-provoking. I also enjoyed the opportunity to network with fellow Principal colleagues.

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL LEARNING AND TEACHING NEWS PREP – YEAR 12

Subject Selection

For students in Years 8-11, this term they will begin selecting subjects and, in some cases, pathways for 2019. Throughout the next few weeks, students will be provided with extensive resources over the coming weeks to assist them in making important decisions about the subjects they will study in 2019.

I recently attended the Australia Catholic Secondary Principal's Conference and had the opportunity to hear Nicholas Wyman, the CEO of the Institute for Workplace Skills and Innovation, speak about the current and future job market. Amongst his key advice to the gathering of school leaders was that students – and their parents – need to think broadly about future career directions and recognise the broad base of skills students now require to be prepared for the world of work.

He emphasised the need for students to cultivate a range of key characteristics: curiosity and critical thinking, positive attitude, adaptability and flexibility and resilience. He also indicated that students – and their parents – need to stop thinking about job titles and instead consider broad job categories. Students need to be mindful that many of the jobs titles they have in mind may become obsolete in the next decade through technological developments, while many new job titles will emerge that we have not yet even conceived of.

With this in mind, it is essential that students approach subject selection thinking broadly about how they can foster their adaptability, creativity, resilience, positivity and openness to ongoing learning and challenge.

To assist students and parents to begin to consider the available options, the Year 10 and Senior Certificates Subject Handbooks are currently available via SIMON and PAM, while the Year 9 Elective booklet will be available shortly. Students are encouraged to spend some time looking through the relevant booklet with their parents and discussing the subjects they are interested in choosing for 2019.

All students involved in subject selection will enter their subject preferences via the online subject selection portal and login details will be provided to students as their portal becomes available.

For each of the year levels involved in subject selection, there are a number of key dates of which students and parents need to be aware. Additional information about these key dates will be provided at the Information Evenings. We would strongly encourage all parents to attend the relevant Information Evening to ensure they are aware of all the options available to students at each of these year levels.

New Archbishop of Melbourne

We wish to share with you the news that Archbishop Denis Hart is retiring after 17 years as Archbishop of Melbourne, and that His Holiness, Pope Francis, has appointed Bishop Peter Andrew Comensoli of the Diocese of Broken Bay as the next Archbishop of Melbourne.

Bishop Comensoli will become the ninth Archbishop of Melbourne.

Born in the Illawarra in 1964, Bishop Comensoli graduated from the University of Wollongong with a Bachelor of Commerce in economics, and worked in the banking sector before switching to theology. In 1986, he entered St Patrick's Seminary, Manly, and was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Wollongong in 1992. Bishop Comensoli served as Chancellor of the Diocese of Wollongong for six years.

Bishop Comensoli was appointed an auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of Sydney in 2011, becoming Australia's youngest bishop.

While we will be very sad to farewell His Grace, Archbishop Hart, I know that all of us will warmly welcome Bishop Comensoli as he takes over as the leader of our Archdiocese. Bishop Comensoli will take up his position in August.

For our Year 9 Project Based Learning (PBL) subject in Term 2, our group chose the topic 'Equality' and we based our idea on equality for people with disabilities. Our idea was to provide an electronic platform where people with disabilities can find jobs more efficiently, similar to the app 'Seek', but specifically catering to people with disabilities. The name of our app is E-Ability, where 'E' stands for employment. The aim of the app is for people with disabilities to advertise their capabilities through submitting their resumes. Then employers will be able to look at resumes to determine if the employee is suitable for a position at their workplace. We focused on catering for people with dyslexia, autism, hearing impairments, and colour blindness in our design. We managed to create a prototype of the app within 9 weeks, showcasing its some of its capabilities, but given more time we would have liked a working model to present.

New Child Care Package - Starting 2 July 2018

On 2 July 2018, the Government's new Child Care Package was launched – replacing the previous Child Care Rebate (CCR) and Child Care Benefit (CCB) with a single Child Care Subsidy (CCS).

This new subsidy is available to all families using Camp Australia services, and may affect the amount of fee assistance that each family will receive. Three things will determine a family's level of Child Care Subsidy:

- Annual income will determine the percentage of subsidy a family is eligible for,
- An activity test will determine how many hours of subsidised care families can access, and
- The type of child care service will determine the hourly rate cap (for OSHC this is \$10.29).

With the roll out of the new CCS, Additional Child Care Subsidy (ACCS) is replacing Special CCB.

What this means for parents and how you can help:

- Parents who are eligible to receive Additional Child Care Subsidy (ACCS) under the Temporary Financial Hardship category will need to submit a claim on the Centrelink website directly.
- If a child has been identified as being at risk of serious abuse or neglect, we can consider an ACCS (Child Wellbeing) claim for them. You will need to provide to your school's Key Account Manager a letter of support, which includes as much information regarding the child's circumstance, if known the details of the agency or referral body and inform the parent that we will contact them to follow up on their claim within the next week.

Should the new CCS create any hardship for parents, Camp Aust. we can organise a payment plan to help parents navigate through this challenging time, you will need to contact Camp Aust. Customer Care team to get this arranged.

Any parent enquiries regarding CCS should be directed to the attached brochure for more information, or to contact Centrelink directly. If you have any other concerns, please do not hesitate to contact our Camp Aust. Customer Care team on 1300 105 343. The team are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week (except National Public Holidays).
