FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Staff, Students and Friends of our Marymede Community,

The VCE Units 3 & 4 Exams finish next Wednesday. I congratulate many of our students for the level of commitment they have shown to their studies over the last few trying weeks. A big thank you for our VCE Coordinator, Vincenzo Rovetto for his efforts in ensuring that the examinations have run so smoothly.

Year 9 Exams

The Year 9 Exams begin on Wednesday 4 December and I have said to our students on a number of occasions that those students who have made a strong commitment to their studies this semester can approach their exams with confidence.

Year 5 Camp

Our Year 5 students and a number of staff will be spending three days together at the Lady Northcote Recreation Camp starting Wednesday 27 November. The camp offers a number of challenging outdoor physical activities for our students. I wish all involved an enjoyable camp experience.

Cyber Safety

We have invited Susan McLean, who is a leading presenter on Cyber Safety, to the College to speak to our Years 4, 6 and 7 students on Wednesday 20 November. We have also booked Susan to speak to any interested parents that evening, commencing at 7.00pm. I strongly encourage parents to attend what promises to be a most informative presentation on the challenges the youth of today face in their use of Social Media.

Staffing

Our Secondary School enrolments will increase by over 100 next year and we forecast that in the next four years, there will be significant growth in our student numbers. In light of this increase in our student enrolments, I have appointed two new

Deputy Principals to start from the beginning of the 2020 school year.

David Broadbent will take up a new position as Deputy Principal Staff & Operations P-12. David is currently the Assistant Principal at Nazareth College. Jessica Hall will take over the Deputy Principal Learning & Teaching P-12 position vacated by our current Deputy Principal, Tracey Kift. Jessica is currently the Director of Studies at Ave Maria College.

I am delighted that David and Jessica will be joining our Senior Leadership Team at Marymede next year.

Gerard Large is in the Acting Sports Domain Leader (7-12) role whilst Ann-Marie O'Hare is on Maternity Leave. We congratulate Gerard on this appointment.

Prep 2020 Orientation: 14/11

This afternoon our Prep teachers will be spending time with their 2020 students. Our Prep Transition Coordinator, Krystal Crichton, has been very happy with the way the students have taken to the Gearing Up for School sessions, held over the past three months.

We also look forward to meeting our incoming Prep parents in the Auditorium. This will give our staff the opportunity to help prepare parents for their child's introduction to Primary School next year.

2020 Years 11 & 12 Students

The Commencement Program for our 2020 Years 11 & 12 students starts next Monday 18 November. These classes are compulsory for our Senior students returning to the College next year.

Secondary Awards Evening: 19 November

We look forward to a large crowd in attendance at our Secondary Awards Evening which will be held in the Fitness Centre on Tuesday 19 November, commencing at 7.00pm. I recommend parents arrive 15 minutes early to allow time to park and walk to the centre.

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL LEARNING AND TEACHING NEWS PREP – YEAR 12

Commencement

Students enrolled in VCE in 2020 will begin their Commencement Program next week and complete a full cycle of classes in their new studies. In organising the program, Commencement lessons are taught by a suitably qualified teacher and prepared by the Domain team to ensure they are a meaningful and essential program for students. However, due to a range of factors, the teachers allocated to the class for Commencement are not an indication of the teacher who will be taking the class in 2020. Students will have their 2020 teachers confirmed when timetables are released on SIMON in late January 2020.

Students will be issued holiday homework to complete in their Commencement classes. This homework is an important part of their preparations for 2020 and all students must have the completed tasks ready to submit by their first classes next year. We recommend students review the homework carefully by December 16 to ensure they can email teachers to ask any clarifying questions prior to teachers commencing their holiday break; not understanding the task will not be accepted as an excuse for non-submission.

Year 7, 8 and 9 Enhanced Learning Program 2019

We were inundated by applications for our 8X and 9X classes for 2019 and have been very impressed by the calibre of the candidates – making final selection a very challenging task! We have also begun the process of selection for our Enhanced Learning Classes for Year 7 next year. We will be creating two year-long Enhanced groups in Year 7 2020, in order to give as many students as possible an experience of this type of learning before deciding in Term 3 2020 whether to apply for a permanent space in the X-classes for Year 8 and 9.

Given the number of outstanding applicants, the selection process will continue over the next few weeks and we

anticipate letters of offer will be sent out to students in final weeks of the term.

In this digital age, the cyber safety of children is a growing concern for families and schools. Cyber safety is one of the most confronting issues for teachers, parents and of course students. At Marymede Catholic College we have a range of measures in place that aim to keep the students' safe while on campus. While most inappropriate behaviour occurs at home, schools are often placed in the position of addressing issues, when a student's online behaviour affects their relationships within the school community.

Susan McLean is Australia's foremost expert in the area of cyber safety and young people. She was a member of Victoria Police for 27 years. Widely known as the 'Cyber Cop' she was the first Victoria Police Officer appointed to a position involving cyber safety and young people. In 2003 she was the Victoria Police Region Four Youth Officer of the Year. Susan is now the director of Cyber Safety Solutions and her expertise is well known. She offers a level of expert advice and assistance not available anywhere else in Australia.

This was a valuable opportunity for students to experience an interview for a potential career job, or for places with higher education providers.

Prior to the interview, I felt well prepared and ready for the questions, as we practiced the week before in class, however, it was quite intimidating at first walking into a room with 50 businesspeople sitting waiting to interview us. As the interview went along, it felt very natural and I could just go with the flow. I felt very confident with the job I "applied" for as I already am currently working at a store just like it.

The interviewer was quite surprised with my experience in an interview and was happy that I came across confident and experienced, which was great for the job they had been looking for. I learned that employers look for candidates that have great people skills and are capable of quick thinking and problem-solving.

In the future, I would like to give more depth to my answers and work on the ending of the interview, learning how to leave more politely or ask a question towards the end. I found this experience helpful as it gave me more knowledge of my strengths and what I can contribute to another person's business but also my weaknesses and what I should do to improve.

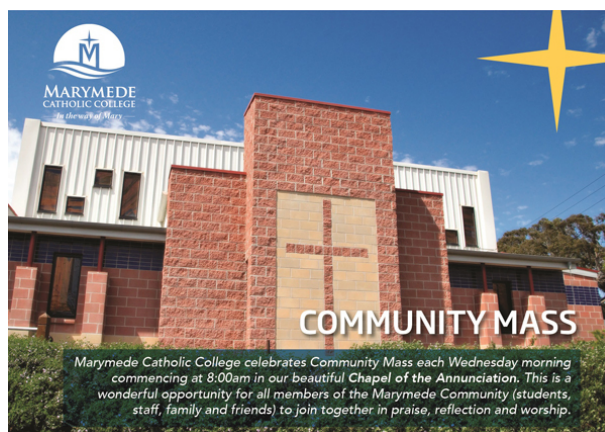
