Reflection Days

Last week our Years 6, 8 and 10 students were involved in their annual Reflection Day. The feedback I have received has been very positive about the experience as we continue the journey of helping our students to be more aware of the needs of others less fortunate in our community. At the Years 8 and 10 levels, we also focussed on the importance of respectful relationships and the impact social media has on teenagers as they move through their adolescent years. School Review 18-20 June

On Tuesday 18 June, Marymede will be involved in a School Review, which takes place every four years. Two reviewers from the Australian Council for Educational Research, Mr. Trevor Gordon and Mr. Tony McGruther and Catholic Education Melbourne Co-reviewer, Ms Denise Mugavin, will make up the panel. They will use the National School Improvement Tool which has its focus on the quality of Learning and Teaching taking place at the College. A number of teaching staff will be interviewed over the three days. Our Student Leaders (both Primary and Secondary) and a handful of parents will also have the opportunity to meet with the reviewers.

I am looking forward to the review as the report will give the College an insight into where we are placed on the school improvement journey. It will also help us in our forward planning as to what areas the school needs to prioritise.

School Uniform

I appreciate that the cold and wet weather we have been recently experiencing has proved to be very challenging as we all endeavour to stay warm. I have noticed that a handful of our students have started wearing beanies to and from school. Beanies have never been part of our winter uniform. - Everyone is equal!

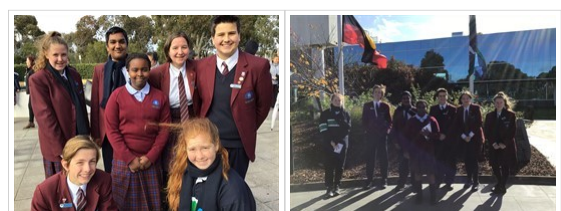
Thank you to all the staff who supported the students and facilitators for each of these days.

Knit-A-Square Is Back For 2019

What a great start with 19 students joining our Knit-A-Square club

We have already received hand warmers, beanies, squares and wool, a big thank you to those mothers and grandmothers.

In November last year, our 800+ knitted squares were packed into water-tight shipping envelopes, sent to Kascare's branch in South Africa and stitched into lovely blankets. The Marymede community contributed enough squares to warm children in the South Africa who would otherwise have been freezing. We feel extremely proud that our small contribution will become wonderful blankets, used to keep orphaned, abandoned or children with AIDS, warm.

Where To From Here

Knitting club is every Tuesday lunch time, Students are currently being sought to learn to knit or crochet 20cm squares that will be sent Zimbabwe, officially the poorest country in the World and Kascare's expanding branch.



With nearly 1,000,000 orphans alive in 2009, Zimbabwe has the highest number of orphans, in proportion to its population, than any other country in the world, according to UNICEF. As many as one in four children in Zimbabwe are orphaned as a result of parents dying from AIDS.
