## My Movements



## NAIDOC WEEK - 5 – 12 July

**Theme: We Stand on Sacred Ground: Learn, Respect and Celebrate**

NAIDOC (National Aborigines and Islander Day Observance Committee) has its origins in the Aboriginal groups of the 1920s

who sought to increase awareness in the wider community of the status and treatment of Indigenous Australians.

Last Sunday at St Francis Xavier church in the city, the Aboriginal Catholic Ministry celebrated a beautiful Mass to mark the end of NAIDOC Week and to farewell Vicki (Walker) Clark known to many of us in Catholic Education over the years, for her inspirational work towards Reconciliation.

The Mass was a moving celebration of Australians, Indigenous and non-Indigenous, gathered as one body in Christ to acknowledge His love binding us together.

The Marymede community acknowledges the custodial presence on the land we occupy and the contribution of the Aboriginal people to our nation and to the Catholic Church. We pledge our efforts towards Reconciliation as we pray:

### THE ABORIGINAL CREED

We believe  
That this ancient land,  
With all its unique creatures, is a precious gift  
From a loving God,  
Who's mercy is over all his works.

We believe  
In God's care  
For aboriginal people who treasure it

### 1000-LETTERBOX DROP – JUSTICE ACTION BY MCATH

Justice Awareness continues to be a focus for the College and, late last term, Year 12 students and their RE teachers undertook a '1000-Letterbox Drop' campaign in the College neighbourhood. The aim of the action was to raise community awareness about the evils of Human Trafficking - a campaign which came about from the hard work and determination of MCATH.


'MCATH' (Marymede Catholic College Against Trafficking in Humans) was founded in 2014 after the Year 12 Religion and Society classes learnt about Human Trafficking. Students were shocked to hear the extent to which human trafficking occurs, in Melbourne and across Australia. After hearing Sr Joan Kennedy (a Presentation nun and member of Australian Catholic Religious Against Trafficking in Humans) speak as part of our Inspirational Catholic Speakers Program last year, a group of dedicated Year 12s decided to form MCATH to raise justice awareness at the College.

The group designed four posters (see some of these below) and a brochure which launched MCATH, aiming to spread their message throughout the wider community. In 2015, MCATH designed an official logo and decided to pursue a campaign in which 1000 informative flyers would be delivered to letterboxes around our local neighbourhood.

MCATH Co-ordinator Ms. Kathy Vlahusic was invited by ACRATH to present the work of MCATH at a Professional Learning Day for all teachers in the Archdiocese of Melbourne. ACRATH also asked the College for permission to present the group's justice awareness posters on its national website.

In addition to the letterbox campaign, MCATH will present its aims and objectives to students at an upcoming assembly with a view to encouraging more students to join and further the cause. Justice awareness posters will be delivered to every Tutor Group in a bid to raise further awareness.

The group continues to work closely with ACRATH, remaining informed about global, national and local issues in human trafficking, whilst focusing on diverse groups and needs. You can read more about the work of ACRATH by visiting <http://acrath.org.au/>
