Year 6 Design and Technology



Students will spend the entire year working through the Product design process to create and make products that they can take home. They use a variety of drawing skills, tools and equipment

to make products that will challenge both their creativity and their technical skills.

It started with a difficult design idea – to make a unique cross for Easter and their Confirmation. The enthusiasm with which the students entered this challenge has been rewarding and the wide range of design ideas totally unexpected.

As their teacher, I have been swept up in their sheer delight of experiencing all that is new and can’t wait for Term 2 when I know they will continue to surprise me.
