2019 Classes

On December 11, our Prep to Year 5 students will participate in a transition day where they will get to meet the students in their classes for next year, spend most of the day in their 2019 classrooms and be introduced to the routines of their new year level. At 2.45pm, students will return to their 2018 classrooms to debrief with their current classroom teacher about their new classes and new year level.

Students in Year 7 in 2019 will spend time on December 11 in House-based groups, familiarising themselves with some of the teachers, classrooms and classmates they will have next year. We look forward to seeing our own Grade 6 students make welcome the many students coming new to the College. Students selected for the Enhanced Learning Program in Semester 1 or Semester 2 next year have recently received letters of offer; thank you to the many families who have replied to accept their places in this program.

Year 8 & 9 class groups for 2019 will be finalised over the coming weeks and lists will be final in late January. Students will find out their new classes at the commencement of Term 1 next year. For Year 10-12 students, students' selections determine the composition of classes in each of their subjects. Significant work will be done on the timetable and class allocations over the Christmas break in an effort to ensure the best possible balance in class sizes in subjects with multiple classes. Students should check their timetable on SIMON in the week beginning January 28 to confirm their final timetable and class allocations.

Considerable work has been undertaken in constructing the class groups for 2019 and a diverse range of factors are considered in constructing class groups. While changing to a new class will be challenging for some students, we would encourage families to support their children with positive

messages about making new connections and to express confidence in their ability to make this adjustment. Given the complexities of constructing class groups that balance the diverse needs of students, we are not able to make changes to class groups based on preferences to be placed with friends or to make changes based on preferred teachers.

At the end of a busy and very positive 2018, I would take this opportunity to thank our teachers, classroom assistants, leaders and support staff for their support of all of our students this year. Wishing all of our students, families and staff a well-earned break and a happy, holy and safe Christmas.

This semester, Year 9 students worked towards solving a real-world client's problem. Students needed to create a potential solution for a problem identified by a person in their community. This task provided students with opportunities to further develop their communication, problem solving and critical thinking skills; all highly sought after 21st century skills. While some students worked with College staff to create resources for events such as Humanities Week 2019 or the Chess team, others fashioned shopping bags or designed materials for local sporting teams.

Annrose Gigimon and Felicity Day write: "For our PBL project, we contacted a company called HelloFresh and worked with them to create a meal kit for teenagers who are on a budget and are confused about a healthy diet, but still want to lead a healthy lifestyle. We discussed partnership options with them and our communication with the company was over email. We created an app called HelloFresh Teen that provided information on our plans and a basic idea of what HelloFresh teen would look like. We would like to meet with HelloFresh and present our app and discuss future partnership deals."

Jarrod Cairns writes: "This year in PBL, Laurence Portella and I designed a Chrome extension. The Chrome extension stops users from entering certain phrases into web pages, like personal information. Later in the year we teamed up with Bjorn Reta and created a proposal for a badge system on SIMON. At school we think it would be good for each student to have a badge allocated for contributions to their school life. Sample badges have been created for College Production, as well as teams such as debating and sports, however the possibilities are as broad as the College's academic and co-curricular programs. We would like to present our idea to the people who own SIMON soon."


Changes in Gates Opening/Closing Times and Gate E Reception from Term 1, 2019

As a College, we are continually striving to achieve the highest standards of Child Safety and Occupational Health and Safety at all times. In line with these endeavours, we are upgrading the system of gates around the campus at entry and exits points.

We have now completed installation of automated car access gates. From 2019, the College will be accessible to parents and students from 8.00am via pedestrian and carpark gates, with active supervision of students from 8.20am. From 9.00am to 3.00pm Students, Parents and visitors will have restricted access (Please see map below).

Our Primary and Secondary Offices have relocated to the Main Reception area. All Parent enquiries will be dealt with at the Main Reception area. Student information, school pass recording (including late arrival and leave passes) will be handled by Student Reception which is located opposite the First Aid area in the Main Reception area. Entry to the Main Reception area can be accessed via Gate E.

The Finance Office has relocated to the old Primary Office building, entry will be via Gate B or the pedestrian gate on Williamsons Road.
