## Restricted Entry & Procedures For Students On-campus

Under the continuing advice of the Chief Health Officer, parents and community members are advised that entry and exit points to the campus continue to be limited as a further measure for protecting the health of our staff and students. This is likely to continue until at least the end of 2020.


All parent access to the campus remains restricted and all parent involvement with activities on-campus is cancelled for the foreseeable future. While the drop-off / pick-up zones will be open for limited times via Gates B, E & F, parents may not park on-campus and **must not exit their vehicle when on-campus**. Unfortunately, this week some parents have been exiting their vehicles. Should this continue, we may be forced to close the Secondary drop-off / pick-up zone.

We are grateful for the cooperation of the overwhelming majority parents and guardians in these procedures throughout most of 2020 and look forward to continuing to work together for the health and safety of all members of our community.

Similarly, while parents may also walk their child(ren) to the student pedestrian access gates (as noted below) you must farewell your child outside the gate: only students may enter the property.

- pedestrian entry 1 (Gate B – Primary School)
- pedestrian entry 2 (near Gate C / Finance – Primary School)
- pedestrian entry 3 (south / left of Admin – Bus stop)

- pedestrian entry 5 (Gate D / chapel)
- pedestrian entry 6 (Gym / Gate E)
- pedestrian entry 7 (Gate G)
- pipe track gate (behind House 7)

## DEPUTY PRINCIPAL LEARNING AND TEACHING PREP – YEAR 12

### Book Week

There is tremendous excitement building among students and staff for tomorrow's annual Book Week parade. There has been plenty of creativity in the running of the events this week due to given COVID restrictions and I'd like to extend my thanks to the staff and parents for their work in bringing this community event to life in even the most trying conditions. Thursday will provide the culmination of many activities throughout the week with virtual author visits, classroom activities and lunchtime reading in the yard. Thank you to Elizabeth Milani, our Literacy Co-Ordinator for her commitment and careful planning of the week.

### Progressive Achievement Testing (PAT)

Progressive Achievement Tests are a series of tests designed to provide objective, norm-referenced information to teachers about their students' skills and understandings in a range of key areas. Over the coming weeks students in Prep – Year 10 will undertake testing in the areas of Reading and Maths. This data will enable us to assess student learning growth over the last 3 terms and be used to assist teachers in targeting their teaching for the remainder of the year. Students are familiar with this testing and will be guided by their teacher throughout the session.

### Year 10 and Unit 1 and 2 Examinations

The examination revision guides have been distributed to parents and students and should be used to assist in the preparation for the upcoming examinations. Teachers will be working closely with students to provide structured, guided revision and continue to build their study strategies and revision techniques. The examination timetable can be found within the revision guide and students are only required to attend the College when they have an examination scheduled.

## Unit 3 and 4 Trial Examinations

All students undertaking Unit 3 and 4 examinations completed their trial papers last week. Students are to be commended for the way in which they engaged in the examinations, arriving promptly and using their time to complete as much of the paper as they could. This additional practice serves as an important preparation for our students and really informs them where they are currently at and what they need to do between now and the official VCAA examination period to ensure they achieve to the very best of their ability. My thanks to the teachers for their work in marking the examinations and providing feedback to students on the areas they should be focussing their revision on. There is still time for students to show vast improvement so I would ask that parents continue to push and challenge their child to work as hard as they can in preparing for their exams.

### Sacraments Update


Year 3 Reconciliation will take place in class groups in November.


The Book Week Book Fair has gone virtual.

## FINANCE OFFICE

### Camps, Sports and Excursion Funding by Victorian State Government

The Department of Education has made changes to the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) to provide more support for families in need.

These changes include the extension of the deadline for CSEF applications to eligible students until Monday 5 October 2020. This will mean that families with new valid concession cards or temporary foster parents can apply for the CSEF. Payments to eligible students will be made at 50 percent of the annual student rate.

Therefore, if you have a valid concession cards or temporary foster parents and have not previously submitted this to the College earlier in 2020, please complete the attached form.
