Parents & Guardians permitted on campus for drop-off and pick-up

Thanks to the further easing of COVID-19 restrictions, we are grateful to be able to welcome back parents on campus for drop-off and pick-up each day. Under COVIDsafe guidelines, the College is still required to keep a record of anyone on campus for longer than 15 minutes, so we ask all parents and guardians to please exit the property promptly after you have picked up or dropped off your child(ren).

Parents and Guardians are asked to please note the following and to please ensure anyone who will be dropping off or collecting your child is aware of these conditions:

- Pedestrian gates will be open from 8.20 9.00am each morning: parents & guardians must exit prior to 9.00am.
- Pedestrian gates will be open from 3.10 3.40pm each afternoon.
- Outside of these times, parents must register at Main Reception to be on-campus for any reason.
- Any students arriving after 9.00am must enter via Main Reception and report to Founders Building to sign in (parents & guardians of Prep – Year 3 students may accompany their child to the sign-in).

- Limited on-site parking is available via Gate A: most parents & guardians will need to park at the train station.
- Parents & guardians are asked to please not enter any buildings during drop-off or pickup. Should you wish to speak with a teacher, please email the teacher ahead of time to confirm availability and arrange a meeting point.

We thank all parents and guardians for your understanding and cooperation.

Pick-up for ill students

Due to the Performing Arts extension construction, the parking bays at main reception will not be available for the remainder of 2021. Parents who need to pick up an ill child during the day are advised to park in the train station pick-up bays directly opposite main reception for ease of access.

Vincent Drive construction continuing through to June 2021

The College has been advised by Yarra Valley Water that construction works along Vincent Drive will be further extended until the end of June 2021.

This will mean continuing delays along a section of the road near the secondary vehicle exit gate that will frequently be reduced to a one-direction single lane, controlled by traffic lights or traffic control staff. Parents are advised to allow extra time in travelling to the College via Vincent Drive until the roadworks are completed. The construction works also mean there is no pedestrian access for students via Gate 7.

STUDENT ABSENCE PROCEDURES

When your child is going to be absent from school, is arriving late or leaving early, parents/guardians are reminded of the following process:

- Ring the absentee line on 9407 9090 and leave a clear voicemail with your child's full name, year level and House, together with the reason for the absence. Parents/guardians can also send an email to absentees@marymede.vic.edu.au with your child's name, date of absence and the reason for the absence. If you are having difficulties leaving a message on the absentee line and can't email, please contact Main Reception on 9407 9000.
- If your child is going to be late for school, please re-iterate to your child that they MUST SIGN IN at the Founders Building Reception area.
- If your child is leaving school early, parents/guardians are to write a note and your child will be required to obtain an early leave pass from their Tutor Teacher or

House Leader. Students MUST SIGN OUT when leaving early and present the early leave pass to staff at the Founders Building Reception area for recording purposes.

Please note that communication of your child's absence/late arrival **must be received no later than 9.30am** on the day of the absence/late arrival. If you do not communicate your child's absence/late arrival by 9.30am and your child does not sign in upon late arrival, you will receive an SMS message advising that your child is absent and requesting you to contact the College to confirm the absence/late arrival.

We have reintroduced the Buddies program in Year Prep and Year 6. While having fun together and building a special relationship, Buddies can create a connection between older and younger students, enabling them to bond more closely with their schooling and increase the likelihood of positive social behaviour.
